During the year under review, the Courts had delivered a number of decisions that made important clarifications to various aspects of civil procedure, such as the framework for adducing fresh evidence on appeal, the power to grant Mareva injunctions in aid of foreign proceedings, principles in applications to set aside service out of jurisdiction as well as the procedural rules applicable to cost awards in the Singapore International Commercial Court.

Cavinder is one of a handful to be appointed Senior Counsel by the Chief Justice of Singapore before the age of 40. He graduated with First Class Honours in law from Oxford University, winning the Bellot Prize for Public International Law from Trinity College, and an LL.M. from Harvard Law School. He is called to the Bar in Singapore, New York, and England & Wales.
