

Family Therapeutic Justice Certification Programme

This professional development certification programme is a collaboration between the Singapore Academy of Law, the Family Justice Courts and the Law Society of Singapore. It is the result of the efforts of Judges from the Family Justice Courts, members of the Family Bar, Mediators, Counsellors and Social Scientists, from Singapore and internationally, working together in the spirit of Therapeutic Justice, as part of the movement to reshape the Family Justice arena.

This programme was conceived to give members of the family bar an appreciation of the spirit and an ethos of Therapeutic Justice and in-depth view of what it means, practically, to be an advocate of Therapeutic Justice.

The complete programme comprises a series of compulsory modules and two elective modules on mediation and valuation. It is recommended that practitioners attend the programme in its entirety (i.e. both compulsory and elective modules).

Module 1: Therapeutic Justice and the Family Lawyer as a 'Therapeutic Agent'

This module seeks to give family lawyers perspectives on the impact of divorce on the family, especially the children, and the importance of focusing on the family beyond the divorce proceedings. The module will look closely at Therapeutic Justice in practice and explore what a multi-disciplinary, solutions-focused approach to family justice means. The module will also examine the inter-personal dynamics in family justice through a "lens of care".

Module 2: The Social Science Perspectives on the Family and Child

In this module, family lawyers will better understand divorce from a psychosocial perspective and the immediate and longterm impact of divorce on the family, financially, emotionally, psychologically and interpersonally. The module looks at how family lawyers can manage and support their clients and their children through the challenges at each stage of the legal process, with a view to giving clients the best start to their lives beyond the divorce proceedings. This module will also cover Family Violence, Mental Health, Impact of Divorce on Children, Co-Parenting and Child Abduction.

Module 3: Interpersonal Skills - The Lawyer as 'Diagnostician'

This module recognises the unique role of family lawyers in the interpersonal space and examines how they can be sensitive to clients' mental and emotional needs and challenges and best support them. Family lawyers will be armed with the skills and knowledge to recognise anxiety, depression, grief and trauma and appreciate when referrals may be helpful or necessary. Topics covered in this module include Empathy, Interpersonal Communication, Motivational Interviewing and Trauma-Informed Practices.

Module 4: The Problem-Solving Lawyer - Mediation and Courtroom Advocacy through the TJ Lens

In this module, family lawyers will be able to adopt collaborative, creative, problem-solving approaches when interacting with clients, opposing counsel and the courts. This module will cover Mediation Advocacy and Courtroom Advocacy in Therapeutic Justice. Family lawyers will appreciate the importance of peer learning and support, and be encouraged to actively engage in community dialogue as co-creators in the evolving landscape of Therapeutic Justice.

Module 5: Personal Wellness - Care for Others begins with Care for Self

This module looks at the unique mental and emotional demands and challenges that come with the job and the importance of building emotional intelligence, emotional capital and emotional courage. In the Therapeutic Justice model of lawyering, awareness of the lawyer's own emotional state is as important as awareness of the client's emotional state.

In the in-person session, insights from neuroscience and research on human consciousness and social sciences for understanding our human condition will be introduced, and a fundamental attribute of all life – energy - the focus to exploring a framework for greater self-awareness and self-regulation. Participants will have the opportunity to reflect on the different human energies and emotions they bring to their role as family lawyers, and how they can better understand and manage their responses given the different influences, situations and stressors in family practice.

Elective Module A: Mediation Essentials for Family Lawyers

The course is an intensive face-to-face training programme to learn the foundations of interest-based family mediation which focuses on the disputing parties' interests and encourages a broader range of solutions.

Participants who successfully complete this Module will be exempted from taking SMC's Strategic Conflict Management for Professionals (Module 1) and may proceed to apply for Strategic Conflict Management for Professionals (Module 2).

Elective Module B: Valuation Essentials for Family Lawyers

This course seeks to arm family lawyers with skills to value matrimonial assets such as trusts, funds, stocks, offshore accounts, insurance policies, CPF investments, overseas investments and businesses and corporations. The course will also examine the common challenges in valuation of matrimonial assets and how to resolve them. Case studies and practical application will form part of this course.

International / local guest speakers



Professor David B. Wexler Professor of Law, University of Puerto Rico

David B. Wexler is Professor of Law at the University of Puerto Rico in San Juan, Puerto Rico, and Distinguished Research Professor of Law, Rogers College of Law, Tucson, Arizona. He is an Honorary President of the International Society for Therapeutic Jurisprudence.

He received the American Psychiatric Association's Manfred S. Guttmacher Forensic Psychiatry Award; chaired the American Bar Association's Commission on Mental Disability and the Law; chaired the Association of American Law Schools Section on Law and Mental Disability; chaired the Advisory Board of the National Center for State Courts' Institute on Mental Disability and Law; was a member of the Panel on Legal Issues of the President's Commission on Mental Health; was a member of the National Commission on the Insanity Defense; served as Vice President of the International Academy of Law and Mental Health; received the New York University School of Law Distinguished Alumnus Legal Scholarship/Teaching Award; received the Distinguished Service Award from the National Center for State Courts; and served as a member of the MacArthur Foundation Research Network on Mental Health and the Law. Professor Wexler has been named an Honorary Distinguished Member of the American Psychology-Law Society. In October, 2012, at its Congress in Pontevedra, Galicia, Spain, Wexler was named Honorary President of the Iberoamerican Association of Therapeutic Jurisprudence. For his work in Therapeutic Jurisprudence, Wexler was presented with the 2019 Alumni Achievement Award from Binghamton University.



Professor Barbara A. Babb Associate Professor of Law, Emerita Founder, Sayra and Neil Meyerhoff Center for Families, Children and the Courts Founding Director, Post-J.D. Certificate in Family Law Program & Editor-in-Chief, Family Court Review

Professor Babb, founder and director of the Sayra and Neil Meyerhoff Center for Families, Children and the Courts and director of the Post-J.D. Certificate in Family Law, is with the University of Baltimore where she teaches several courses in the family law area, including Family Law and, Child and the Family. She has led the design and development of the nation's only Post-J.D. Certificate in Family Law, and now directs the program.

Professor Babb's scholarship focuses on an interdisciplinary, holistic approach to family law through the application of therapeutic jurisprudence, the ecology of human development, and the creation of unified family courts. She is the author (with Judith D. Moran) of Caring for Families in Court: An Essential Approach to Family Justice (2019), a book that envisions the family court as a care center, blending contemporary theories with an ethic of care and narrative practice. She also has written on family law issues in various publications including the Southern California Law Review, Indiana Law Journal, Family Law Quarterly amongst others. Babb is a frequent presenter at the national and international levels on unified family courts, family justice system reform, and family law decision-making. In 2016, the Association of Family and Conciliation Courts appointed Professor Babb editor-in-chief of the Family Court Review, the leading interdisciplinary academic and research journal for family law professionals. Babb has served on the Review's editorial board since 1999 and has also written numerous articles for the journal. She is an Advisory Board member of the Institute for the Advancement of the American Legal System's Family Justice Program. Babb also serves on the Curriculum Committee of the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges. She is a past Chair and current Executive Committee Member of the Family and Juvenile Law Section of the Association of American Law Schools. Babb has served as a member of the Family and Juvenile Law Section Council of the Maryland State Bar Association and has co-chaired the Family Courts Committee of the American Bar Association's Section of Family Law.



Professor Vicki Lens Professor, Hunter College, City University of New York

Dr. Vicki Lens is currently a professor at the Silberman School of Social Work at Hunter College, City University of New York. She has dual degrees in both social work (B.S.W., M. S. W., Ph.D.) and law. Prior to receiving her Ph.D. in Social Welfare, Dr. Lens worked as a public interest lawyer. As a legal aid lawyer she provided legal services to low income people. She also served as an Assistant Attorney General under New York State Attorney General Robert Abrams. Her primary research interest is in socio-legal studies, where she uses ethnographic and other qualitative methods to study the judicial system, including an ethnographic study of child abuse and neglect cases in Family Court. Her research has been funded by the National Science Foundation, the Fahs-Beck Fund for Research and Experimentation, The Robin Hood Foundation, The Lois and Samuel Silberman Fund of the New York Community Trust, and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. She has authored over sixty articles in peer-reviewed journals, books, encyclopedias and law reviews and is the author of Poor Justice: How the Poor Fare in the Courts, published by Oxford University Press. She has presented her research and lectured at universities, community organizations, and government agencies, including assisting in the training of administrative law judges and family court judges in New York State. She is also a founding member of the International Society for Therapeutic Jurisprudence.



Mr Charlie Asher

Attorney and Co-founder of Freedom 22 Foundation, CharlieAsherLaw.com.

Charlie Asher is an honors graduate of both Earlham College (B.S. 1974) and Indiana University School of Law (J.D. 1977) and an AV-rated attorney. For 20 years Charlie concentrated his practice in criminal defense, earning annual recognition in The Best Attorneys in America. Then in 1997 he stopped taking new cases except for select pro bono ones and dedicated his professional time to leading the creative teams of three free resources for better legal service to the public.

In part due to witnessing the ways in which contentious family breakups often injured children and led to the involvement of many of them in an array of self-destructive behaviours, Charlie has led the team creating and constantly updating UpToParents.org. This ground-breaking free and bilingual website has been used by more than 250,000 separated, divorced, and never-married parents to build their better futures by focusing on meeting their children's needs, especially their need for peace in their family. The website's unique personalization and interactivity have earned it many prestigious awards, including the ABA Dispute Resolution Section's "Lawyer as Problem Solver Award" and the Association of Family and Conciliation Courts (AFCC)'s "Judge Irwin Cantor Innovative Program Award." Charlie has lectured to judges and bar leaders in over 300 counties about the development of comprehensively cooperative systems of family law. Charlie gathered the lessons from those collaborations into AssessFamilyLaw.org, a free tool jurisdictions can use to assess and improve their family law systems.

Beginning about four years ago Charlie decided to use the successful experiences with UpToParents.org and AssessFamilyLaw.org to circle back to his roots in criminal defense to lead the development of DefenseMap.com. Currently Charlie concentrates his professional time presenting about these websites, helping with their implementation, and consulting on criminal cases where clients have used DefenseMap.com.

District Judge Suzanne Chin District Judge, Family Justice Courts

Suzanne graduated from the National University of Singapore and was admitted as an Advocate and Solicitor of the Supreme Court of Singapore in 1987. She commenced practise as a commercial litigation lawyer but later moved to focus on commercial law spending the bulk of her career in the corporate arena. In 2014, she joined the Legal Service in 2014 and was appointed District Judge in the family justice division of the State Courts, now the Family Justice Courts. As District Judge, Suzanne hears a wide range of matters in the Family Justice Courts including divorce and ancillary matters, as well as maintenance and family violence disputes. Additionally, Suzanne has conducted mediations and is a qualified mediator with the Singapore Mediation Chambers.



District Judge Yarni Loi District Judge, Family Justice Courts

District Judge Yarni Loi earned her LLB (Hons) from the London School of Economics and Political Science and obtained her Postgraduate Diploma in Singapore Law from the National University of Singapore. After being called to the Singapore Bar, she spent the bulk of her career in private practice as a corporate litigation lawyer in a top tier law firm in Singapore where she was Director. In 2011, she started pursuing part-time studies in counselling and was awarded a Postgraduate Diploma in Counselling by TCA College (accredited by the University of Wales) in 2013. As part of her counselling studies, she completed a full-time counselling internship at a Family Service Centre for 6 months. She joined the Legal Service and was appointed District Judge in the family justice division of the State Courts, now Family Justice Courts, in March 2014.



Dr Robin M. Deutsch, Ph.D., ABPP Professor of Clinical Psychology ,William James College

Dr. Robin Deutsch is a Board Certified psychologist (Couple and Family) who provides consultation, mediation, parenting coordination and expert witness services in Wellesley, MA. She developed and was the director of the Center of Excellence for Children, Families and the Law at the William James College where she is currently a Professor of Clinical Psychology. Previously she was an Associate Clinical Professor of Psychology at Harvard Medical School and Director of Training and Forensic Services in the Children and the Law Program at Massachusetts General Hospital. She has published extensively on issues related to attachment, alienation, co-parenting after divorce, high conflict divorce, parenting plans, and parenting coordination, and is the co-editor with Abigail Judge of the book Overcoming Parent-Child Contact Problems: Family-Based Interventions for Resistance, Rejection, Alienation (Oxford, 2016). She is a cofounder of Overcoming Barriers and she currently serves as Chair of the American Psychological Association (APA) working group to Review Scientific Literature Regarding High Conflict Family Relationships with Child Involvement.

Dr. Deutsch served on both the first Association of Family and Conciliation Courts (AFCC) and APA task forces that developed Guidelines for Parenting Coordination, the AFCC task force for Guidelines for Examining Intimate Partner Violence and the AFCC task force for Court-Involved Therapists. She is a former President of AFCC (2008-2009) and Chair of the APA Ethics Committee. (2007), and current President-elect of the American Board of Couple and Family Psychology (ABPP CF). Dr. Deutsch is a fellow of APA, 2006 recipient of the American Psychological Association Karl F. Heiser Presidential Award for Advocacy, the 2017 recipient of the Massachusetts Psychological Association Kenneth D. Herman, Ph.D. J.D. Career Contribution Award, and the 2018 recipient of the AFCC John E. Van Duzer Distinguished Service Award.

Dr Daniel Fung is the CEO of the Institute of Mental Health in Singapore. He is an Adjunct Associate Professor at all 3 Singapore medical schools. Dr Fung is the President of the International Association for Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Allied Professions and President of the College of Psychiatrists, Academy of Medicine, Singapore. Dr Fung has co-authored over 200 peer reviewed research papers, books and book chapters.

Mr Benny Bong is a Marital and Family Therapist in private practise. He has over thirty-five years of experience in counselling, teaching and consulting. In his counselling practise, he specialises in couple counselling, working with troubled relationships where there is abuse and violence and working with men. In 2008, he wrote Couples in Crisis. He currently teaches Marital and Family Therapy at the National Institute of Education, National University of Singapore and the Singapore Bible College.

Mr Bong is the current President of the Society Against Family Violence, a non-profit organisation he helped form 30 years ago. He was one of the principal researchers in the Society's International Violence Against Women Survey in 2009. In 2011, Benny was one of two recipients of the AWARE inaugural Hero Award. The other is none other than the President of Singapore Her Excellency Ms Halimah Yacob.

After having qualified as a barrister-at-law in England and admitted to the Singapore Bar in March 1997, Mr Rajan Chettiar worked in one of the oldest and most prestigious law firms in Singapore. Having caught the entrepreneur bug and a strong desire to use his legal skills to assist individuals, he then set up the firm of Rajan Chettiar & Co in 2003 which specialises in all aspects of family and personal laws. He is currently the Managing Director of Rajan Chettiar LLC.

He is an Associate Mediator of the Singapore Mediation Centre and a court-appointed volunteer mediator of the State Courts and Family Justice Courts in Singapore. He mediates civil, criminal and family matters. He also runs one of the first private mediation companies in Singapore, Resolvers Pte Ltd, which offers mediation services to assist parties to resolve their matters through mediation instead of resorting to litigation.

He is one of the first collaborative lawyers in Singapore and handled the first collaborative family law case in Singapore in early 2013. He is appointed as a Child Representative by the Family Justice Courts to assist the Court on complex child custody and access cases. He is a trained Parent Coordinator and a Singapore International Mediation Institute (SIMI) Certified Mediator. He is also qualified to mediate cross border family disputes. In 2016, he was recognised as an Outstanding Volunteer (Advocate and Solicitor category) by the State Courts in Singapore. He has also been recognized for his contributions to the Law Society of Singapore on two occasions.

Rajan has been appointed to be a director of the Board of the International Academy of Collaborative Professionals in the United States of America. He is the second Asian to serve on the Board. An active member of the Law Society of Singapore, he was a past member of the Council of the Law Society of Singapore and currently serves on various committees. He is regularly featured in local newspapers, radio and television in Singapore on family-related issues. A prolific writer, he writes a monthly column in the Singapore Law Gazette.
