Mr Mathias Goh

Mathias Goh is currently regional legal counsel with the Carlsberg Group's Asia office based in Hong Kong. He manages the legal affairs of Carlsberg's Hong Kong, Taiwan and Macau businesses, in addition to working on commercial transactions, projects and disputes within Asia.

Prior to joining Carlsberg, he was part of the international arbitration team of the Singapore office of Norton Rose Fulbright where he was involved in a number of high-value, cross-border litigation and arbitration disputes across multiple industries such as infrastructure, energy, FMCG and technology. Before Norton Rose Fulbright, he worked as a commercial litigator in one of Singapore's leading litigation firms. He is called to the Singapore bar and is admitted as a solicitor in England and Wales.

Paul Tan is a partner of Clifford Chance Asia - Cavenagh Law LLP. He is called to the Singapore and English bars. His cases often involve complex issues of private and public international law.
